Foundation News

This week the Foundation students have been very busy getting ready for their 100 days of school celebrations. In Literacy and as part of learning about non-fiction texts, the students have explored a cupcake recipe. We then followed the recipe to make our own cupcakes. The students worked in small groups and all had a go at adding ingredients, cracking eggs, mixing the bowl, and scooping the mixture into the cupcake pan. The following day the students made icing to go on the cupcakes. This was a great opportunity to build oral language skills and provided an excellent opportunity for writing as students recounted their baking experience. In Number, the students have also been learning all about the concept of 10 and the -ty numbers. They have been developing their understanding that the -ty numbers mean groups of ten. To develop this understanding the students have been building towers of ten using blocks and creating groups of ten using bundling sticks.



Grade 1/2 News

This week the students in Grade 1/2 have been looking at shapes in Numeracy. They know that 2D is short for 2 Dimensional and are flat shapes. They will also look at 3D shapes and study their properties. Here a few comments about what they have learnt or enjoyed so far:



“2D shapes are flat and have sides and corners.” Ava 1/2A

Grade 3/4 News

It has been a very busy few weeks in 3/4 as we begin all our new topics for this term and revise what we have learnt in Semester 1.

Last week the students worked very hard to develop and create a presentation based on their achievements for Semester 1 and their goals for Semester 2. The students used their creativity skills to individualise their presentations, and looked back through their work books to determine what their biggest achievements were. We are very proud of the students and how they presented these at their Student Led Conferences.

On Thursday the 1st of August, we were lucky enough to have David and Jodie from Victoria Police visit the 3/4 unit. They showed us the various parts of their uniform and belt, and shared many insights into their careers and daily job. They were fantastic at teaching the 3/4 students about how to stay safe in the community, how to ask for help when needed including what number they can call - 000, and gave many tips on how to ensure we are safe on all platforms including the internet and social media apps.



Grade 5/6 News

The 5/6 students have settled well into term 3. We have started our new unit on space, and the students are intrigued by how gravity effects normal day occurrences in space, such as washing your hair. In literacy, the students have been working hard to identify the features of non-fiction texts, in particular information text and biographies.

The grade six students attended Gladstone Park Secondary College on Tuesday 23rd of July, to watch their production 'Guys and Dolls'. The students had a fantastic time, and loved the performance. The grade six students also had a 'welcome back to term' special lunch with their buddies, and showed them some of the work they have been doing

The 5/6 students have worked really hard in creating PowerPoint presentations for their student led conferences. The students presented these to their parents on Wednesday 31st July. All the students did a great job in showcasing their achievements in semester 1, and setting some goals for themselves in semester 2.

Well done 5/6 students on a fantastic start to term 3!



Art News

To celebrate the fantastic Art Work undertaken by all of our students we are holding a Tullamarine Primary School Art Show during Book Week.

Students are timetabled to go through the Art Show with their grade and teacher during the week so that they can discuss the Art Work (either theirs or others) with their teacher and friends. Parents and carers are invited to come along with their children - details will be provided closer to the date.

Through the course of the year students have been encouraged to develop an appreciation for art and develop their confidence and enjoyment in creating their own Art Work. They have experimented with a variety of media and materials and have practised the skills, techniques and processes involved in creating art.

Numeracy News

This term the students in years 1-6 will be working on skills in multiplication and division.

The year 1/2 students will be developing strategies, with the use of equipment, for making equal groups for multiplication and sharing into equal groups for division. Year 1/2 students do not need to work on knowing their multiplication facts.

For students in Years 3-6 it is important that they do start to learn their multiplication facts, up to 10X10 and related division facts. This is the expected student outcome for students at the end of year 4 - Students recall multiplication facts to 10 x 10 and related division facts.

One way in which to have the students see that it is easy to learn all these facts is the term – 'Three for Free'. This means that if you know one fact then you automatically know another 3 facts, for free. No need to think of them. For example:

If you know $3 \times 6 = 18$ then for 'free' you know $6 \times 3 = 18$, $18 \div 6 = 3$ and $18 \div 3 = 6$.

Foundation students will be developing their understanding of 'ty' and 'teen' numbers. For example the difference between 60 and 16. Developmentally it's important for these students to understand that 'ty' numbers are groups of ten and 'teen' numbers are a group of ten and some more.




The Book Fair will be open:
