Grade 3/4 News**Swimming:**

Swimming has commenced this week for the Grade 3/4 cohort. It is a two week programme that consists of a total of eight sessions. It is held at Broadmeadows Leisure Centre. All students participating in the lessons have shown excitement and eagerness to learn some new and important swimming skills. Each session has been designed to work on each student's strengths and weaknesses so students can gain more confidence with their swimming. It has been a cold start to the week, however, that has not affected the students as they continue to push through the weather to have a worthwhile experience during each session of swimming. Great work to the Grade 3/4's so far!!!

**Grade 5/6 News**

We had a busy couple of weeks in 5/6. In Reading, we have been working on inferential questions about the text we read. Students have been drawing conclusions about how a character is feeling throughout a fiction text. Students have been looking for evidence to support their answers.

In Writing, we have been learning about how to write a fairytale. Students spent a lot of time planning for their fairytale. Students have had great success in using descriptive language for their setting and characters. They are now putting their plan together and drafting their fairytale.

In Mathematics, we have been building on our subtraction skills. Students are learning about problem solving strategies and how to rename in a subtraction vertical algorithm. We are currently also learning about shape. Students had the opportunity to explore how many nets a cube has! They had so much fun!

In Inquiry, we are currently looking at 'Natural Disasters'. Students have been given an opportunity to choose their own natural disaster and are becoming experts. Students will be sharing what they have learnt at the end of this term to the rest of the cohort! They are really enjoying and engaging in their learning!

We unfortunately did not play Interschool Sports last week, due to the weather conditions. There are only two more games for this term. We are all so sad that is coming to an end soon, but students have really learnt so many skills during this semester!

Grade 3/4 News Swimming:

Art news

This term has been an exciting time in Art with many wonderful pieces of artwork being produced by the students! The year 5/6 students have undertaken an artist study; learning about Georgia O'Keeffe and abstract art. The students recently completed beautiful Georgia O'Keeffe inspired abstract paintings of poppy flowers. They have also explored using paint, black ink and charcoal to create their own artwork. The year 1/2 students have had a great start to Art this term! Students have really enjoyed creating Van Gough inspired Sunflower paintings and making Aboriginal snakes. They have been learning about Primary and Secondary Colours, Aboriginal art and drawing and painting techniques. The foundation students have been doing a fantastic job of creating artwork using a range of materials this term. Highlights include making self-portraits, weaving 'snakes in the grass' and creating paintings of fruit. If your child doesn't have an Art Smock can you please provide an Art Smock or old shirt for your child to use during Art lessons. Please ensure items are labelled with your child's name. Thank you to those families that have provided newspapers to the art room! We are always in need of newspaper and we have a box outside the Art room door to drop newspapers in.

Numeracy News

What has been happening in our classrooms?

This week I spent time in 5/6B & D working with the students on nets that make a cube. This is covered in Geometry with the students learning to build pyramids and prisms. I had the students working 'backwards' from what they have normally done and gave them the cube to deconstruct and lay flat into a net. The challenge for the students was to work in small groups to discover how many different nets could be made. The two classes found around 7 different nets but they didn't find all that can be found! (Although one group did manage to find 10) This is what some of the students said about their learning.

I learnt that it is amazing how there are so many different types of ways to make a cube and that it really gets you thinking when you try to make all the different combinations. – **Monique**

Doing that maths activity was really fun and interesting to find out there are 11 ways to make a cube net. My group had found 10 nets and one of them, no other group had found. I really enjoyed participating in that activity. – **Deia**
