

The students have enjoyed learning about questioning and inferencing in their reading, whilst in writing they have learnt how to write procedures. After publishing




their procedural text on 'The Best Sandwich', students got the opportunity to present their work to their class.














#### 3/4 Unit

We have had a very exciting last few weeks to finish off term 3! We have been able to complete lots of learning as well as enjoy our exciting camp to Lady Northcote.


This is what we have been doing:



Reading – students have been exposed to different types of non-fiction texts to read, this has been closely linked with writing. They have read biographies, newspaper articles, procedural texts, and information

Writing - the students have continued to write different non-fiction texts and have found interesting ways to present their work. Some examples were biographies, which

were presented digitally using BookCreator, recounts and information reports were presented on a poster.



Maths - They have been learning about multiplication and division and the relationship between the two. Students can explain what a fact family is and use multiplication facts to calculate division facts. They have also been working very hard on their own knowledge of the multiplication facts. In our secondary area, they have learnt about volume, capacity, mass, area, and length.

Inquiry - Our topic of Chemical Science has had students investigating absorbent materials, change in state of matter and recycling.

Camp - most students went on camp in week 7 to Lady Northcote Camp in Bacchus Marsh. The students got to enjoy three days there, and completed activities like archery, flying fox and the giant swing. All the students pushed themselves to complete activities outside of their comfort zone and were helpful in their duty groups. The staff at the camp were very friendly and happy with how the students behaved.

We have had an amazing term and look forward to term 4 and lots more learning.

#### 5/6 Newsletter Item Term 3 Week 10

The 5/6 students have had a fantastic Term 3. We have had an incredibly busy term, with swimming and will end it with a 3-day camp to Bendigo/Ballarat! The students will engage in a range of activities at Sovereign Hill, including the Red Hill Mine, Candle Dipping and The Aura Sound and Light Show.

This term the students have been investigating solids, liquids and gases in our unit 'What's the Matter?' and have engaged in a range of experiments to discover which elements are reversible or irreversible.

They have used this knowledge and applied it during our writing sessions where they have created their own Scientific Reports, which included a hypothesis, procedure, experiment and results.

The 5/6 students have enjoyed hands on tasks for our Volume unit of work, where they have been able to work collaboratively to create a metre cubed scaled-model.

We have had a great term and look forward to all the exciting things ahead in Term 4!





# Visual Arts Term 3

During Term 3, all the students focused on the artist, Pablo Picasso. Grade 1/2 students looked at Henri Matisse, Grade 3/4 students researched Henri Rousseau. The Junior school students went on a texture and shape hunt.

The Grade 5/6 students all worked on researching, investigating, collaborating and making lots of decisions about the Dairy Australia's Picasso Cow program. After many weeks of hot doting, discussing and working in teams the cow has a name, Bessy.

At Tullamarine Primary School we use **Compass School Manager** app for all our communications to families.


This is where you can log your child's absences, see what events are coming up, check what news has been sent from the school or email your child's teacher.

If you are having issues using the app or have forgotten your password, please contact *Jodi in the office* and she will gladly help you.


#### This is what the home screen looks like when viewing in a browser
