Alternatively, If you have not enrolled your child as yet, please collect an enrolment form from our office, or request a form to be sent home with a sibling. If you know of any families with enrolments for next year, please remind them to contact the office as soon as possible. We ask that as a school community we all take every opportunity to promote our fabulous school to potential families.

The third Foundation transition session will take place tomorrow at 11:45am with the final session next Wednesday16th November, which will include a parent information session for all of our new foundation families. The 2023 foundation students have been extremely settled and the teachers have enjoyed getting to know the new children.

Please note that Friday 18th November is a pupil free day. On this day all staff will be taking their Professional Practice Day. This is a day that is given to all teaching staff in Victorian schools to focus on professional learning. Our staff have elected to take their day on the 18th November and School Council approved this as a pupil free day. Camp Australia is open for care on this day. Please contact them directly.

The remainder of this term looks like being a very busy time. All the year levels have a range of excursions and activities planned between now and the end of term. All students will participate in two Step Up sessions, where they will experience teaching and learning in next years grade levels. On the last day of the school year, Tuesday 20th December, all students will meet their 2023 teacher and classmates. It is always a very exciting time.

As a result of this process we are pleased to have made the decision to appoint **TeamKids** as our new OSHC provider. The TeamKids OSHC service will commence **in the Summer**Holidays on the 9th of January 2023. The Before and After Care will commence when students return on Monday the 30th of January 2023. The program will continue to run out of the OSHC room in the School Hall.

We are confident that the partnership that we now have with **TeamKids** will benefit all students and families at our school.

The 1/2 Cohort

What a wonderful start we have had to Term 4.

Last Friday we had our very first excursion to the Melbourne Zoo. Students were so excited to catch the bus and see all the animals. We had some very exhausted and tired students by the end of the day.

The 1/2 students still have a lot more to do this term. We will be practicing our end of year celebration performance and attending our 8-day swimming



program at the Broadmeadows Aquatic centre.

We have also just finished a unit of persuasive writing where students learnt the purpose of a persuasive text and different persuasive devices they can use to convince their audience.

Students will be completing their assessments over the next few weeks to determine their learning growth. It is extremely important that students have headphones to assist them.









3/4 Unit

It is hard to believe we are well into term four and summer is approaching! The students have worked very hard all year and have readily taken on challenges in their learning.

In Reading, we have been using fiction texts to build skills to improve comprehension. Students have used inferencing to determine character traits, emotions and reasons why characters do the things they do. This takes a lot of skill when reading; having to draw on the 'clues' the author provides rather than reading it directly in the text.

In Writing, students have been learning how to create different fiction texts. They have written stories that include suspense, adventure and fantasy. They have been building their knowledge of language features and have used a variety of planning tools to record their ideas.

In Maths, students have been learning about fractions and decimals. While this is a new concept for most students, they have managed to show a good understanding. They have experimented with fractions on a number line, fractions of shapes, collections and have created fraction walls to assist with equivalent fractions. Our secondary focus for our students has been learning about location and how to read and recognise features on a map. This has been closely linked to our Inquiry topic of Geography.

In Geography, the students created an inquiry question. The question related to urban and rural parts of Australia and why capital cities were built on the coast. A lot of learning about Australia! Our next inquiry question allows students to explore the vegetation and rainfall over parts of Australia where they plan to 'build a farm' based on the information they find. They are creating open and closed questions to determine the information they need for their farm to be successful.

Like all other terms, this one has been very busy. Although it is hard to believe that the year is coming to an end, we have more teaching and learning and fun activities to come. While it has been challenging to keep ourselves healthy over the year, please ensure you remember "it's not OK to be away".

GRADE 5\6 NEWS

Literacy

Students learnt about (narrative) comics. They were exposed to a variety of comic strips such as Peanuts (Charlie Brown and Snoopy) and explored their text features. Students investigated and analysed the different conventions that are unique to comics such as speech and thought bubbles, panels and gutters, narrative boxes, pictures and lettering. They also determined the purpose of each convention as well as discussed what they looked like in terms of format and layout. Students composed their own narrative comic strips which included an orientation, complication, resolution and conclusion.

Numeracy

Students completed a unit of work on Volume and Capacity. They learnt about the similarities and differences between the two concepts using class created anchor charts and participated in many hands-on tasks individually, in small groups, as part of the whole class and as part of the 5/6 cohort to strengthen their understanding. Students designed and constructed one metre cubes using a variety of material such as cardboard and coloured paper, identified several units of measurement for volume and capacity and their abbreviated terms such as cubic centimetres (cm3), cubic metres (m3), millilitres (mL) and litres (L), calculated the number of cubes required to make 3D constructions and ordered the capacity of different containers (with the same unit) from smallest to largest (and vice versa) using scaled instruments.





Incursion

Students were privileged to be a part of an engaging and entertaining Graffiti (incursion) presentation earlier in the term. Some of the key messages of the presentation were:

- doing illegal graffiti is a CRIME
- say NO to tagging
- in order to create legitimate Street Art, you need PERMISSION

Students also learnt about 'saying no' strategies to get them out of tough situations. Some of these were:

- It's cool man... it's not for me (said with a smile)
- Don't speak or reply
- I said 'No!'
- Leave/Walk away
- Give an excuse (That sounds awesome but I can't) e.g. I need to go to the toilet (set up an upcoming phone call for the next 5 mins) Pretend your parents need you back home in the next 30mins when you answer the (fake) phone call
- Disappear


















REMEMBRANCE DAY 2022

At Tullamarine Primary School we use **Compass School Manager** app for all our communications to families.


This is where you can log your child's absences, see what events are coming up, check what news has been sent from the school or email your child's teacher.
